#### Safeguarding: Legal Changes to the PVG Scheme

Two major changes are being made to the PVG Scheme in Scotland with effect from 1st April.

**Firstly,** it is now a **legal** requirement for those carrying out a **regulated** role within an organisation to have PVG clearance through that organisation. Failure to do so is a **criminal** offence for both the individual and the organisation.

**Secondly,** if an individual holds a position of responsibility in an organisation which has as one of its main purposes the provision of benefits to children, they will require to be on the PVG Scheme. Within the context of the Free Church of Scotland, this means that every member of a Deacons' Court or Finance Committee requires to be a PVG Scheme member. There is to be a 3-month grace period, meaning that congregations have until 1st July to ensure compliance with these new provisions.

An email has been sent out to Safeguarding Co-ordinators and Clerks to Deacons' Courts and Finance Committees, drawing attention to these changes.
